Administrator Zeldin:

I am writing today to request you immediately investigate coordination between career staff in the EPA Region 10 office in Seattle, Washington, and extreme environmental activist groups that resulted in the closure of the Cow Palace dairy Yakima County, Washington. Your prompt attention to this matter is appreciated.

As you know, the EPA Region 10 office serves Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, Washington, and over 270 tribal organizations. For the last fifteen years, and perhaps longer, career staff in several divisions—including the Air and Radiation Division, and Enforcement and Compliance Assurance Division—had free rein to pursue their own activist agenda.

The result of the coordination was the closure of the Cow Palace dairy which had been in operation since 1972. More than 120 employees lost their jobs, and Cow Palace was forced to liquidate their herd of 7,500 dairy cows.

Farmers, ranchers, and landowners across the country are the original stewards of our environment; they recognize the importance of clean air, land, and water to produce the food and fiber our country needs. In my district, these men and women are among the most hardworking, resource-conscious Americans that I know, yet it is clear that the career staff at EPA incorrectly see them as a threat to the environment.

Included in this correspondence is documentation provided under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) which demonstrates clear coordination between EPA career staff and the anti-animal agriculture environmental activists.

Dear EPA- Attached please find recent groundwater reports from View Point Dairy, located north of Sunnyside, WA. As you can see, two wells on the site exceed the Safe Drinking Water Act standard of 10 ppm nitrate. Thus, this CAFO, as with every other CAFO that CARE, FOTC, and CFS have sued or settled with in Washington, also presents an imminent and substantial endangerment to human health and the environment. Residences downgradient of View Point Dairy, along with results from the GWMA testing, have also shown wells in excess of 10 ppm. It is more than time to take action against all Large CAFOs, not only in the Lower Yakima Valley, but also across the nation, to stop this rampant and ongoing contamination of communities. We hope you will do so- the evidence is incontrovertible. Thank you

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Ed and Jeff,

Thank you again for meeting with us to discuss the situation in the LYV and LUB. As you've seen, FOTC and ORA have followed up with specific details and needs for their respective areas by email. We also wanted to follow up as a group with a couple next steps:

- 1. We request a follow up call in April to specifically discuss the pending SDWA petitions and EPA's thinking moving forward. We suggest a 2-hour hold to make sure we have enough time. While we appreciate the information sharing that we've been doing, it is essential for the communities in the LYV and the LUB to have commitments from EPA so that state efforts do not drag on forever without the needed progress. The recently filed class action suit in the LUB indicates the seriousness of the region's issues and inadequacy of the state's response. We appreciate the EPA's promise that it's not going anywhere, and that promise needs to be paired with actionable timelines and expectations.
- 2. Our call last week made clear that 1 hour is insufficient to address the details of both WA and OR every few months. With that understanding, we'd like to separate our quarterly check in calls so that EPA meets with the WA petitioners separately from the OR petitioners and ORA. We believe that will provide a more productive space for dialogue and working together. If EPA is amenable to this, we will follow up separately.

Please let us know your team's availability for a call here in April and we'll get that on calendars.
